Anarchist Mountain Fire Department (AMFD)



The Anarchist Mountain Fire Department formed in 2003 following a devastating wildfire that raced up the mountain destroying several structures. Today's fire department has grown to have a group of highly skilled, paid-on-call members continuously training to the standards of the Office of the Fire Commissioner. First Responder medical assistance, as well as Wildland Firefighting Capabilities, are also available. Burning regulations can be found on the AMFD website.

Anarchist Mountain Community Society (AMCS)



The Anarchist Mountain Community Society (AMCS), is a not-for-profit community group formed in 2007. The Community Society brings together the interests of residents and landowners on Anarchist Mountain to create a sense of community, preserve its natural setting and promote living in harmony with the native flora and fauna of the Mountain. The Community Society has been successful in being a forum for community discussion, so that the Mountain is an exceptional place to live. Go to the AMCS website for more information.

ENCom (Emergency Notification & Communication)



The ENCom Team/ Leads “help neighbours notify neighbours” in times of emergencies. Anarchist and Sidley mountains are divided into areas with Leads who gather info for a “phone tree” and an “automated system”. In an emergency, these systems will notify by phone, each resident that is affected by the emergency. The two systems work simultaneously so neighbours are notified. ENCom may also assist the Fire Chief in further communications of emergency situations.

FireSmart



The Anarchist Mountain FireSmart Committee (of AMCS) educates residents on how to prepare and protect homes and the community in the event of a wildfire, as well as taking action to reduce the threats. Resident involvement is key to being recognized as a FireSmart Community. To assist in this, free property assessments, equipment rentals and disposal of materials at Wapiti Pit are available.
